Dear Mr. Cyrier:

The construction documents submitted with the above referenced applications have been found to be in compliance with the requirements of the Ohio Basic Building Code (OBBC). One set of the construction documents with an Ohio Board of Building Standards (Board) approval stamp on each sheet is being returned to you with this notice. These plans are to be copied and used for submission to building departments and one set must be available at all times for use by your quality control/assurance and in-plant construction personnel to assure that units constructed will conform to these approved construction documents.

This letter authorizes industrialized units (produced at your authorized manufacturing facilities in accordance with the enclosed drawings) for use anywhere in Ohio pursuant to Section 3781.12 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC).

Section 4101:2-1-62 OBBC requires that an insignia be obtained from the Board and affixed to each industrialized unit before it is delivered and set in Ohio under this authorization. Refer to the section for further information and cost of insignia. Insignia usage shall be reported monthly.

THIS AUTHORIZATION IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS: A set of approved construction documents with the Board approval stamp, site related construction documents required to be submitted by Section 4101:2-1-19 OBBC, and a copy of this letter shall be submitted to the building official (or other authority with jurisdiction if there is no building official). Units shall not be set or installed at the site unless the approved construction documents have been submitted and are available at the site for the field inspector to use in verifying that the unit matches the design approved by the Board. Field inspectors are authorized to inspect the units and require such tests be conducted as required by the OBBC but shall be limited to the extent that destruction of the unit or any of its assembled components will not occur.
