Dear Mr. Buchholz:

Again the City has received complaints on the property at 419 Robinwood Lane.

I accompanied the Litter Control Agent for Henry County to the property today and found fenders, doors and other car parts laying on the front lawn, a car in the side yard dismantled, a 4 X 8 sheet of plywood laying against the south side of the house, cement blocks piled within the right-of-way of the street, a shed with the door hanging off and the entire shed in need of repair and paint, debris, rubbish and just a general mess in the rear yard and a dog tied to the rear shed with dog droppings in the front and rear yards.

Under Chapter 92 of the Codified Ordinances, this property has been considered a nuisance. You are in violation of 92.01A structures out of repair and dilapidated, 92.01D the accumulation on a lot of rubbish or other materials which shall or will, if the condition continues, attract or propagate vermin, 151.33 take repairing or dismantling of motor vehicles within a residential area that would become a business or would in any way change the character and be a detriment to the surrounding properties shall be considered a nuisance under Section 92 of the Codified Ordinances. The repair or dismantling of motor vehicles is permitted by the owner or a tenant on their own personal vehicles as long as it does not cause a nuisance to or depreciate the value of property within the general vicinity. The condition of your property has caused the City much concern. The nuisances listed above shall be corrected within fifteen (15) days of this notice or the Law Director will be notified and legal action taken.
