Dear Mrs. Hinds:

On January 12, 1961 I made an inspection of the building at 134 W. Washington Street which is being altered for use by Shondell Jewelers.

Mr. Shondell has engaged an electrical contractor to install new lighting fixtures, but the existing asbestos insulated wiring is prohibited in a business location by the National Electrical Code which is a part of the City Building Code Ordinance No. 404. The recommended method of installing electrical wiring is to use a rigid metal conduit as a carrier for all wires. In the basement rigid metal conduit as a carrier for all wires. In the basement the old original wiring is run in a conduit which will pass inspection. The electrical work that has been done from time to time is the work that will have to be replaced and installed according to code.

If there are any questions you may have concerning our new building code we would be happy to answer them.
