

Sanitary & Storm Sewer Connections

Dear Mr. & Mrs. Benecke,

It was recently discovered that the sanitary sewer for the above referenced property is connected to the City of Napoleon's storm sewer. This constitutes an illegal connection and must be rectified. You are hereby given notice of ninety (90) days to connect your sanitary sewer to an existing sanitary sewer manhole located near the northwest corner of the above referenced property.

Because the catch basin in the parking lot is connected to the same line as your sanitary sewer, the two (2) lines will need to be separated. The storm sewer can stay connected to the line that it is connected to now, as long as the sanitary connection is properly removed, rerouted, and the existing connection to the storm lateral plugged.

You also expressed concern regarding recent flooding that took place at the above referenced property. After investigating the issue and performing some preliminary drainage calculations, I determined that you do not have sufficient storage (detention) on you property. According to my estimation, you should have a storage capacity of several thousand gallons. Generally on sites similar to yours this is achieved through the use of underground storage tanks or pipes. Another storage option that is frequently utilized is the parking lot surface. This is what is happening at your property. However, because you do not have sufficient capacity, it is sometimes entering your building. I recommend installing underground storage tanks or pipes to fix the issue, but this is at your discretion.

Please note that the neighboring property to the east also drains into the catch basin in the parking lot. No calculations were done to estimate the amount of storage required for this property. I recommend that you hire a civil engineer licensed in the State of Ohio to assist you with these calculations.

The City of Napoleon requires that all sanitary sewer connections be inspected by the City of Napoleon's Engineering Department. Also, permits will be required to allow you to tie into the

sanitary sewer. Please contact the City of Napoleon's Engineering Department to obtain all the proper permits and inspections. If you have any questions or require any additional information, please contact our office at your convenience.
