**A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A SECOND RIVER BRIDGE IN  
AND FOR THE CITY OF NAPOLEON, OHIO**

**WHEREAS**, the City desires to encourage commercial and industrial development and create and preserve jobs and employment opportunities within the City; **Now Therefore,**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPOLEON,  
OHIO:**

Section 1. That, this City Council formally supports the construction of a second river bridge in and for the City of Napoleon, Ohio connecting the City's two industrial areas, and allowing for traffic from the south industrial area to reach the new U.S. Route 24 and rail facilities.

Section 2. That, it is found and determined that all formal actions of this City Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in open meetings of this City Council, and that all deliberations of this City Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and the Codified Ordinances of Napoleon Ohio.

Section 3. That, if any other prior Ordinance or Resolution is found to be in conflict with this Resolution, then the provisions of this Resolution shall prevail. Further, if any portion of this Resolution is found to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution or any part thereof.

Section 4. That, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect at the earliest time permitted by law.



AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE CURRENT MARCH 2017 REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE CITY OF NAPOLEON, OHIO CODIFIED ORDINANCES

In this legislation, the City of Napoleon authorized the approval of the current March 2017 replacement pages to the City's Codified Ordinances, specifically the Traffic Code and Fire Code.

In this legislation, the City of Napoleon authorized the expenditure of funds over twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) related to the construction of a training facility for the City Fire Department, contingent upon the presentation of a proper performance bond.
