A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS OVER TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000.00), AND ELIMINATING THE NECESSITY OF COMPETITIVE BIDDING, FOR THE PURCHASE OF HARDWARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE THE MOBILE CAD INSTALLATION PREVIOUSLY APPROVED BY RESOLUTION NO. 049-17, UTILIZING THE FEDERAL COOPERATIVE PURCHASING PROGRAM, WHICH WAS NOT INCLUDED IN THE 2017 MASTER BID RESOLUTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the City of Napoleon Police Department desires to purchase the required hardware to complete the installation of Mobile CAD, previously approved by the passage of Resolution No. 049-17; and,

WHEREAS, the necessary hardware can be purchased utilizing the Federal Cooperative Purchasing Program, and,

WHEREAS, the Council believes it is in the best interest of the City of Napoleon to eliminate the necessity for competitive bidding, Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPOLEON, OHIO:

- Section 1. That, the City of Napoleon authorizes the expenditure of funds in excess of \$25,000.00 for the purchase of necessary hardware to complete City of Napoleon Police Department Mobile CAD software, utilizing the Federal Cooperative Purchasing Program. Further, Council finds it to be in the best interest of the City to eliminate the necessity for competitive bidding.
- Section 2. That, pursuant to the Charter of the City of Napoleon, Ohio, Section 6.05, Elimination of Competitive Bid or Proposal Permitted, and Napoleon Ordinance 106.04, Competitive Bidding Eliminated, when the City may otherwise be required by the laws of Ohio, ordinance or resolution, to make any purchase or contract of any type of property or services, or contract for purchases or services by competitive bid, the proposal process, or qualified base selection process, Council may eliminate the necessity therefor in the best interest of the City, as determined in the sole discretion of Council by a majority vote of the current members of Council.
- Section 3. That, this Council previously authorized the City Manager to purchase the software component of the Mobile CAD installation, by passage of Resolution 049-17 on August 21, 2017.
- Section 4. That, the City Manager is directed and authorized to enter into a contract for the purchase at issue in this legislation.
- Section 5. That, it is found and determined that all formal actions of this City Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in open meetings of this City Council, and that all deliberations of this City Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and the Codified Ordinances of Napoleon Ohio.

- Section 6. That, if any other prior Ordinance or Resolution is found to be in conflict with this Resolution, then the provisions of this Resolution shall prevail. Further, if any portion of this Resolution is found to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution or any part thereof.
- Section 7. That, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City and its inhabitants; therefore, provided it receives the required number of votes for passage as emergency legislation, it shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect at the earliest time permitted by law.
