RESOLUTION NO. 033-19

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER, WITH ASSISTANCE FROM THE MAUMEE VALLEY PLANNING ORGANIZATION, TO EXECUTE AND SUBMIT ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT A TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT GRANT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation has set aside monies for Transportation Improvements Districts (TID) in the State of Ohio; and,

WHEREAS, registered TIDs can apply for these monies and be selected for funding by the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation; and,

WHEREAS, the Henry County Board of Commissioners has established and registered the Henry County Transportation Improvement District; and,

WHEREAS, the Maumee Valley Planning Organization (MVPO) assists the City with preparing TID grants; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Napoleon's American Road & Oakwood Avenue Improvements Project is a transportation activity eligible to receive TID funding; and,

WHEREAS, the American Road & Oakwood Avenue Improvements Project located within the City of Napoleon at Oakwood Avenue, from Freedom Drive to American Road, and American Road, from Industrial Drive to Oakwood Avenue, are necessary to support economic development in the City of Napoleon; Now Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NAPOLEON, OHIO:

- Section 1. That, the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to, with the assistance of the Maumee Valley Planning Organization, execute and submit any and all documents necessary to apply for and accept a Transportation Improvement District Grant for the American Road & Oakwood Avenue Improvements Project conforming to the plans and specifications on file in the office of the City Engineer.
- Section 2. That, the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute and deliver all applications, agreements, program compliance covenants, and any other documents as may be appropriate to secure such grant funding from the Ohio Department of Transportation.
- Section 3. That, the City of Napoleon hereby understands and agrees that participation for the Transportation Improvement District monies, if awarded, will require compliance with program guidelines and assurances.
- Section 4. That, it is found and determined that all formal actions of this City Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in open meetings of this City Council, and that all deliberations of this City Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code and the Codified Ordinances of Napoleon Ohio.
- Section 5. That, if any other prior Ordinance or Resolution is found to be in conflict with this Resolution, then the provisions of this Resolution shall prevail. Further,

if any portion of this Resolution is found to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution or any part thereof.

Section 6. That, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City and its inhabitants, and for the further reason that this legislation must be in effect at the earliest possible time to meet the grant deadline; therefore, provided it receives the required number of votes for passage as emergency legislation, it shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect at the earliest time permitted by law. Further, the Emergency Clause is necessary to begin the application process in a timely manner, and for further reasons as stated in the Preamble hereof.
