# Press Release

On October 03, 2020 Officers from the Napoleon Police Department attempted to stop a vehicle for a traffic infraction that occurred on Scott St. During that traffic stop, the operator exited the moving vehicle and fled on foot. At that time the driver was identified as Logan Chilcote, 29, of Findlay, OH.

Mr. Chilcote was found to have four active warrants for his arrest from surrounding agencies, all entered with caution and violent tendencies.

Specifically:

- Wood County - Contempt of Court original charge Possession of Cocaine and additional warrant for Obstruction of Justice
- Seneca County – Condition of Judicial Release Violation
- Fulton – failure to appear original charge being assault

On October 15, 2020 Mr. Chilcote was found to be inside 230 Northcrest #21 located in the City of Napoleon. A knock and talk was attempted at the apartment however no one would come to the door. With the assistance of the City Napoleon's Warrant Entry Team and the Multi Area Narcotics Task Force, a search warrant was obtained for the residence and Mr. Chilcote was taken into custody without incident. A search of the residence resulted in locating over 200 grams of alleged methamphetamine and 14 grams of alleged cocaine with a street value of over \$10,500

Mr. Chilcote was charged with Obstruction of Official Business a felony of the fifth degree, trafficking of a schedule 1 or 2 controlled substance, a felony of first degree, and trafficking in cocaine a felony of third degree.

Further charges are forth coming.

Additional assistance was obtained from Napoleon's K9, Ohio Adult Parole Authority, Henry County Prosecutor Gwen Howe-Gebers, and the Henry County Sheriff's Office.
