



We also conduct school patrols, building checks and public relation talks. Any call that an arrest can not be made should be considered non-criminal.













Monthly Traffic Arrests






911 CALL TYPES










NAPOLEON POLICE DEPARTMENT DETECTIVES BUREAU SUMMARY REPORT 2007

The Napoleon Police Department Detectives Bureau has directly conducted or been actively involved in the investigation of over 250 Felony and Misdemeanor criminal cases in the year 2007. The bureau is also responsible for the collection of crime scene evidence, preservation and security of all evidence, and responsible for the custody chain of all evidence, and safe keeping of found property. With those responsibilities are packaging standards of all seized evidence, inventories, and property disposition. The Bureau transported in excess of 100 items of evidence for analysis to the Bureau of Criminal Investigations State crime lab in Bowling Green, Ohio.

The Detectives Bureau also works with the Henry County Prosecutors office and schedules all Grand Jury notices for the Police Department. Detectives are on call 24 hours a day and are often utilized for specific techniques while recovering and processing evidence, crime scene processing, the viewing of video surveillance, interview and interrogations, and the scheduling of all polygraph examinations. The Bureau is also responsible for investigation of every child abuse and sex complaint reported in the City. Those investigations often require meetings with members from Children Services, Victims Advocacy, the Rape Crises Center, and the Department of Adult Probation.

Public relations also relate to the Detectives Bureau for drug awareness presentations. K-9 units from other jurisdictions also completed a narcotics search of the Junior High and High School. Detectives attend monthly meetings with neighboring departments in order to gather information of criminal activities in the NW Ohio Region that often aid in localized investigations and the suppression of criminal activity trends.

The Bureau is responsible for all special operations and is currently working with detectives from the Henry County Sheriff's Office while creating a joint task force to combat local crime and narcotics enforcement that will preserve a much safer community. During these joint operations over 23 multiple drug purchases were made resulting in 19 indictments that were handed down by the Henry County Grand Jury. These indictments were served by units from both Henry County Sheriff's office and the Napoleon Police Dept. The Detectives Bureau is utilized to draft subpoena's, prepare search warrants, and generate photo line up forms. They aid with investigations requiring evidence recovery, the release of secured personal records, and suspect identifications. Detectives also represent the police department as board members of the Juvenile Case Flow Management Committee and provide advice that will aid in the successful prosecution and rehabilitation of juvenile offenders.

In order to assist patrol units and enhance continuity of follow-up investigations; The Detective Bureau will be notified as soon as possible, when any of the following complaints are received.
